

Greetings Brethren from the West,

I would like to thank Worshipful Brother Sean Harris for his generous and kind words spoken at our Hiram Award Ceremony back in February and sharing it in the March 2023 Trestle Board. I am truly humbled. I feel it's only proper for me to dedicate my April Trestle Board to Sean and share with all of you my speech that I presented that evening.

Good evening, friends, family and brethren.

I ask why are we here this evening? Does anyone know?

Plato once said: "A hero is born among a hundred, a wise man is found among a thousand, but an accomplished one might not be found even among a hundred thousand men."

We are here to celebrate a friend and recognize a brother who is truly one of a hundred thousand. A man of accomplishment. A devoted husband and father. A Brother who truly emulates the character of a Mason and does it unceremoniously. A friend and confidant and dare we say, man of "wisdom". Whose voice is esteemed, and his counsel taken to heart. Whose vision for success in life is admired and for this Lodge entrusted.

Who is this superman you ask? We are speaking about our dear friend Sean Harris. A Brother whom I deeply admire and respect.

Sean Anthony Harris was born April 3, 1969 to Paul and Julie Harris. He spent his formative years in Livermore California graduating from Granada High School in 1987 and Graduate of Chabot College in Hayward, California. Sean's early career started in law enforcement and 7 years after high school he married his high school sweetheart Mariana in 1994 and are approaching their 30th wedding anniversary. Their only daughter Angelina was born in 1998. After his career in law enforcement concluded, Sean has since built a career in growing and advancing technology start-ups. He's been with his current company Backblaze since 2010, having been one of its first few employees, which is now a successful Silicon Valley data storage company that has since this past November gone public and now has over 400 employees. The 2023 dues information:

The Grand Lodge approved raising the per-capita payment from \$57.50 to \$60.50 per year, per member.

As a result the **2023** lodge dues are now **\$85.50** per year. (\$25+\$60.50)

Our life membership is pro-rated based on age (which is good for older members). Those interested in a life membership should refer to the table below and contact me if you want to convert your membership to lifetime.

\$809.320. LIFE MEMBERSHIP.

A sum of money equal to the Lodge's annual dues at the time of purchase of the life membership multiplied by the factor indicated opposite the member's age in the following schedule:

Age 49 and under, a factor equal to or greater than 24 times annual dues; **\$2052**
50 to 54 inclusive, a factor equal to or greater than 20 times annual dues; **\$1710**
55 to 59 inclusive, a factor equal to or greater than 18 times annual dues; **\$1539**
60 to 64 inclusive, a factor equal to or greater than 16 times annual dues; **\$1368**
65 to 71 inclusive, a factor equal to or greater than 14 times annual dues; **\$1197**
and Age 72 and over, a factor equal to or greater than 12 times annual dues. **\$1026**

2022 dues cards expired on Dec 31, 2022.

With iMember2.0, members can now pay their dues themselves with a credit card online

How to Pay Dues By Credit Card

This new, convenient way to pay dues has been in affect since last year. Here's how it works:

1. Log in to the Member Center at member.freemason.org and follow the prompts to "Pay Dues". If members haven't already logged in, all **they will need is their member number, lodge number, and email address**. The system takes VISA and Mastercard.

2. Once paid, the member will be able to download a new dues card immediately.

3. Secretaries will be able to see which members have made their payment on a special dues dashboard, which will automatically update Intacct as well, if the lodge is using Intacct.

4. Every month, secretaries will receive an itemized report for all of the monies collected. Please note that credit card processing fees are charged to the member.
